And with a changed expression said, with a lovely smile:

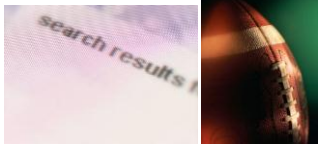
"I know my dad marched here today - this is ANZAC Day.

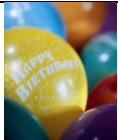
