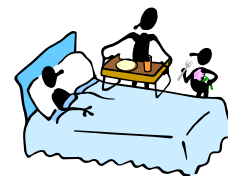

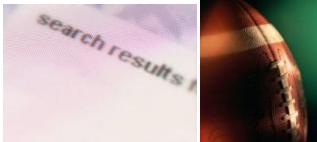
Plans for next year’s event include a street stall before Christmas. More details to follow.

Season for patrols runs from September to April during which time beaches are monitored by Lifeguards and Radio Operators .

Due to retirements we at Surfcom (Surf Communication), are looking for new volunteers to man the radio for a few hours per month.

We monitor beaches from Warilla to Ulladulla plus Air Patrols and Jet Boats.

As we continually update our methods you must be computer literate, as to the radio and reporting, on the job training will available.
